


Yes or No questions - Most translations (Universal)






Question: Do any of these extra biblical book titles seem completely unfamiliar to you?

- 5. The book of the acts of Solomon (1st Kings 11:41)








Question: Is this the first time you are hearing about a passage that says that they brought babies to Jesus to touch them? NOTE: (Not children to bless - babies to touch)


Luke 18: 15 (Most translations) - "And they brought unto him also **infants, that he would touch them**: but when his disciples saw it, they rebuked them. "


Leviticus 4:32 (Most translations) And if he bring a lamb for a sin offering, he shall bring it a **female** without blemish.





Question: Is this the first time you are hearing about any reference to woman with wings?







Luke 19:27 (Most translations) "But those mine enemies, which would not that I should reign over them, bring hither, and slay them before me."





Leviticus 12:8 (KJV Only) "And if she be not able to bring a lamb, then she shall bring **two turtles**, or two young pigeons;







Isaiah 60:16 (KJV Only) "Thou shalt also suck the milk of the Gentiles, and shalt **suck the breast of kings:**


Job 21:24 (KJV Only) <u>His</u> breasts are full of milk, and his bones are moistened with marrow.





Question: We all remember "the fool says in his heart there is no God," but is this the first time you are hearing about a different passage that says "there is no God?"


Isaiah 45:14 (KJV Only) "...they shall make supplication unto thee, saying, Surely God is in thee; and there is none else, **there is no God."**



Question: Is this the first time you have heard of Jesus refferred to as a "Holy thing?"


