## Evidence that the Bible is supernaturally changing is now undeniable

We have all been told the Bible **cannot change** — but what if that belief is based on a **doctrine that isn't a doctrine**? **Millions of believers worldwide** are now testifying that their Bibles are supernaturally changing and virtually all church leaders refuse to discuss it....WHY?

### How could this be true?

Because the **Doctrine of Preservation** is based on **two fragile assumptions**:

1. **Theological Necessity** – The belief that “it only makes sense” that God would preserve the scriptures. But Jesus warned us: *“In vain they worship Me, teaching as doctrines the commandments of men” (Matthew 15:9).*
2. **Misused Promises** – Scriptures like Psalm 12:6–7 and Matthew 24:35 are used out of context to claim the Bible is untouchable. But careful exegesis shows these verses were never about paper and ink preservation.

### Why would God allow this?

God Himself is bringing this judgment because many church leaders have overemphasized scripture at the expense of hearing His voice. They've traded a Spirit-led, supernatural faith for an intellectual, miracle-free gospel — just like the Pharisees, who searched the scriptures thinking they held eternal life. Now, God is responding with a Tower of Babel-style judgment to bring us back to our first love — the living, New Testament Christianity.

### The Evidence is Real

MISCONCEPTION #1 - THE DOCTRINE OF PRESERVATION IS NOT A DOCTRINE

1) Theological necessity claims that because the word is inspired or because God went to so much trouble to give us the word, "IT ONLY MAKES SENSE THAT HE WOULD PRESERVE IT. But this is not a doctrine, it's an assumption that is taught as a doctrine. (Matthew 15:9) Therefore it cannot be relied upon to claim that the scriptures are unchangeable.

## 2) 7 preservation promises refuted

Psalm 12:6-7 – Refers to the people being protected, not the words themselves when read in proper context.

John 10:35 – It means scripture must be obeyed, not that it can't be changed. (See John 5:18)

Isaiah 40:8 – Affirms the permanence of His truth, not the ink on man-made pages.

Matthew 24:35 – Affirms the enduring authority of His teachings—not the preservation of ink and paper.

Psalm 119:89 – The jurisdiction of the preservation is NOT on the pages of the book

Isaiah 59:21 – A promise of ongoing spiritual communion—not a promise to preserve the written text

1 Peter 1:23 – Highlights the new birth through a living, spiritual principle—not a claim that the written Bible is unchangeable or incorruptible.

Many believe the Bible cannot change because it's inspired by God, but inspiration doesn't guarantee preservation, contrary to popular belief.

### MISCONCEPTION #2 - THE SCRIPTURE CAN'T CHANGE BECAUSE GOD DOESN'T CHANGE

Just because Jesus is the same yesterday today and forever doesn't mean that the scriptures have a force field around them. I am the Lord I change not, is not a preservation promise for the scriptures

### MISCONCEPTION #3 THE SCRIPTURES CAN'T CHANGE BECAUSE GOD CANNOT LIE

This argument presupposes that God has promised that his scriptures would not be changed but as we are about to see he's never promised that therefore if the scriptures are changing he's not lying.

### MISCONCEPTION #4 - THE DEVIL ISN'T POWERFUL ENOUGH - OR - GOD IS POWERFUL ENOUGH

It hasn't occurred to Bible Believers that God is the one calling for this. Amos 8:11 ( Removes word as a judgement) Rev 13 (God gives power and permission to prevail against the saints) Job 1 (Removes hedge)

## EVIDENCE FROM SCIENCE

The scientific discipline of probabilities proves the Bible is supernaturally changing. There are at least 15 or 20 scriptures that virtually everyone will misremember the same way including you. But for probabilities to prove that this is impossible we only need 5

The chances of 5 people misremembering 5 bible quiz questions the same way...BY CHANCE.... is  $10^{25}$  That's 1 in 1,000,000,000,000,000,000,000,000 (I added one for good measure)

Unless you can provide a rational explanation for this repeatable empirical evidence, the only possible explanation is that the Bible has been supernaturally changed. There has to be a cause if an entire forest falls over. In a similar way, there has to be a cause for everyone to misremember the same way.

Here are the "fill in the blanks" questions

1) Matthew 7:1 (KJV) Judge not \_\_\_\_\_ ye be judged

ACTUAL Matthew 7:1 "Judge not, that ye be not judged." –

2) Job 1:21 (KJV) The Lord \_\_\_\_\_ and the Lord \_\_\_\_\_ away

ACTUAL: Job 1:21 "The Lord gave, and the Lord hath taken away; blessed be the name of the Lord." -

3) Exodus 12:23 (All versions) Who killed the firstborn of Egypt (Death Angel)

ACTUAL: Exodus 12:23 For the LORD will pass through to smite the Egyptians; and when he seeth the blood upon the lintel, and on the two side posts, the LORD will pass over the door, I will not suffer the destroyer to come in unto your houses to smite you.

4) Genesis 32:24 (All versions) Who did Jacob wrestle with (An angel)

ACTUAL: Genesis 32:24 And Jacob was left alone; and there wrestled a man with him until the breaking of the day.

5) Isaiah 11:6 (All versions) Who laid down with the lamb (the Lion)

ACTUAL: Isaiah 11:6 The wolf also shall dwell with the lamb,

6) Genesis 8:11 (All versions) What did the dove bring back to Noah to indicate that it found land (Olive branch)

Genesis 8:11 And the dove came in to him in the evening; and, lo, in her mouth was an olive leaf pluckt off:

## EVIDENCE FROM TESTIMONY

Our research shows that millions of Christians now affirm this phenomenon as real. If you can't explain how so many are misremembering the exact same way, your objection to our testimony is invalid. Without a valid objection, our testimony stands as evidence — true and reliable.

## EVIDENCE FROM CORRECTED DOCTRINE

The universal habit of conflating the term “scripture” and “word” has led to a misapplication of preservation promises. God's promise to preserve His "word" is not the same as a guarantee to preserve the written scripture. John 1:1 and Revelation 19:13 clearly teaches that “the Word” refers to Jesus, not the Bible itself. Therefore, using these promises to claim that the Bible or scripture cannot change is theologically unsound.

## WHERE WILL IT BE PRESERVED?

It's never dawned on most Bible believers to ask WHERE God will preserve His word. It turns out that none of the promises teach that it will be preserved on paper. In fact, it specifically says it won't be on paper. 2 Corinthians 3:3 clearly says it is “not with ink,” pointing to a non-written form of preservation. A return to an oral tradition.

## PRESERVATION VS INNACCESSIBILITY

God's word can be preserved yet still made inaccessible as a form of judgment. Over sixteen hundred languages have no Bible, though His word is preserved. In the same way, God is now judging the modern church — making the scriptures inaccessible through a Tower of Babel judgment, because they've turned the Bible into an idol.

## GOD WOULD NEVER ALLOW THE BIBLE TO BE CHANGED? (Yes He would)

Here is a list of scriptures that show God's willingness to remove his word as a judgment in the past

Amos 8:11 Behold, the days are coming, declares the Lord GOD, when I will send a famine on the land...not a famine of bread or a thirst for water, but a famine of hearing the words of the LORD.

Lamentations 2:9 Her king and her princes are exiled among the nations, the law is no more, and even her prophets find no vision from the LORD.

Psalm 74:9 "We see not our signs: there is no more any prophet: neither is there among us any that knoweth how long."

1 Samuel 3:1 And the word of the Lord was rare in those days; there was no open vision."

2 Chronicles 15:3 "Now for a long season Israel hath been without the true God, and without a teaching priest, and without law."

Ezekiel 7:26 then shall they seek a vision of the prophet; but the law shall perish from the priest, and counsel from the ancients."

Micah 3:6 "Therefore night shall be unto you, that ye shall not have a vision; and it shall be dark unto you, that ye shall not divine; and the sun shall go down over the prophets, and the day shall be dark over them." Then shall the seers be ashamed, and the diviners confounded: yea, they shall all cover their lips; for there is no answer of God."

Hosea 4:6 because thou hast rejected knowledge, I will also reject thee, that thou shalt be no priest to me: seeing thou hast forgotten the law of thy God...

#### EVIDENCE FROM PROPHECY

Revelation 22:18 – A direct prophetic warning against altering the text of scripture.

Daniel 12:4 – Points to a sealed prophecy (Dan 7:25) that would only be understood at the end of time.

Daniel 7:25 - The little horn (Dan 7:8) will "seek to change times and laws"

Amos 8:11 - A precedent that God is willing to remove His word as a judgement

2nd Thessalonians 2:9 "...whose coming is after the working of Satan with all power and lying signs and wonders"

Revelation 13:7 the dragon was given power and authority to make war with the saints and to prevail

Revelation 13:4 ..."who can make war with him?"
