

## Examples of scriptures that have been supernaturally changed

### *Universal & KJV Only*

The following passages are both wildly unfamiliar to virtually all humans who know their Bibles, and they are doctrinal paradoxes that should not be in our Bibles. Good luck defending these atrocities and convincing the world—and Christians who have integrity—that these particular words and themes are the inspired word of God. No! God is judging the church for turning the Bible into an idol.

These exact words that you read in the passages below appear in most translations, so they are not caused by modernizations or Bible version confusion. You will find them in the 1611 Cambridge KJV, all five revisions, the 1769 Oxford Edition, as well as the ASV, NIV, ISV, NLT, ESV, BSB, BLB, NKJV, NAS (NASB 1995, NASB 1977), LSB, Amplified, CSB, Holman, CEV, ERV, Majority, NET, New Heart, Websters, Weymouth, World English, LSV, Berean, Young's, Smith's, Douay-Rheims, Catholic Public Domain, NAB, NRSV, LAMSA, Aramaic, Anderson, Godbey, Haweis, Mace, Weymouth, Worrell, and Worsley.

If they are in virtually every version, we can't be confusing them with other translations. If they are in the original texts and all revisions—which they are—then we can't be confused by modernizations. So, my question to you is: if this is the inspired word of God, are you willing to make a public defense of each one of these?

Are you going to continue to gaslight your followers into believing that this particular phrasing has always been in all of our Bibles. If that is true, then why can I go onto any Christian podcast and share these passages and 90% will admit that it's the first time they have ever heard of them.

Any attempt to mindlessly continue to bloviate that these passages have always been this way and the Bible can't change will only demonstrate that your doctrine has become an idol. These passages are wildly unfamiliar to virtually everyone and completely unlike the God we have always known? Why doesn't that shock you to the core?

There are two lists. The first is found in virtually every version, and the second list is KJV only. We don't care if it's a parable or if you have some commentary to explain why it's supposed to be in there. These passages were never in our Bibles like this. Don't you know your Bible? What's the matter with you?
